

Labour Market Oriented Curriculum Development seminar was organised in hotel Maestral from 20th to 21st February 2009 in order to familiarise the participants with the theory and practice of labour market curricula development in the EU and the region under the guidance of international and home experts. The seminar is one of the activities foreseen within the Labour Market Oriented Curriculum Programme implementation, where new chair programmes will be introduced at four different faculties of the University of Montenegro: Faculty of Maritime Science, Faculty of Natural Science and Mathematics, Faculty of Physiotherapy and Faculty of Tourism and Hotel Management.

Some of the topics covered at the seminar were:

Skills and competences for the European labour market and whether employability can drive curricular design; Linking levels, learning outcomes and assessment; The framework for higher education and the labour market; Tuning educational structures to the needs of the labour markets: cases of social sciences and teacher training; Current situation at Montenegrin labour market from the perspective of Montenegrin Employment Bureau and Developing gender sensitive curricula.

The seminar was attended by around thirty participants, mainly representatives of the University of Montenegro, business sector, ministries and the media.
