Vision:

KOSOVO— Open and democratic society **integrated in the European Higher Education Area**, where knowledge and research are base for a sustainable cultural, social and economic development.

Mission:

Development of an effective higher education system contributing to the welfare of the Kosovar society by offering a high quality education and research, with equal opportunities for all, in accordance to the values of liberty, democracy and diversity.

Higher Education - Kosovo context

- Unemployment: 40%
- Population under 25 years of age: >50%
- Decrease of the quality of education in the last decade of the 20th century
- Brain-drain

- Strong academic orientation
- Stay away from business mentality- Relevance of study programs to labor market needs
- Misbalance between offer and demand

Main goal for the Higher Education in Kosova

➤ HE reform the modernization and integration of the HE system within EHEA

Why a new Law on Higher Education?

- ➤ Independence for the Republic of Kosovo, February 2008
- Development of the European Higher Education Area
- ➤ Pluralistic and increasingly mature nature of Kosovo's HE landscape in 2010 more public Universities alongside a fully-licensed yet diverse private sector
- Establishment and full operation of the Kosovo Accreditation Agency

The major changes

- ➤ A stronger focus on European concepts and instruments, both in relation to student mobility, curriculum design and quality assurance
- Provision for the development of new Universities, University Colleges and other institutions
- Parity of treatment for the public and private sectors within an inclusive framework
- Devolution of powers to HE institutions within a strong framework of public accountability

Main principles of the new Law on HE

- > Academic freedom,
- **Equality under the law** of all providers of higher education;
- ➤ **Equal opportunities** for all students and staff in higher education institutions;
- > **Diversity and quality** in programmes of study and in support for learning;
- > Creativity, innovation and entrepreneurship as key objectives of higher education providers and programmes alike;
- ➤ A **European and international focus** in all areas of higher education, providing for student and staff mobility and comparability of standards in awards and qualifications;
- A commitment to **research and scholarship** to support teaching and learning and to extend the boundaries of knowledge and understanding within Kosovo and the wider world;
- Active **engagement of students**, both individually and collectively, in the life of their institution and in their own learning;

This draft Law on Higher Education will facilitate:

- > the development of new, legitimate and accountable provision of HE by robust and dynamic institutions, and
- > operating fully within the protocols of the European Higher Education Area

Actualities in HE in Kosova Increase of the participation in HE

- Establishment of UPZ
- ➤ Addresses the need for increased participation of youth in higher education and dispersed educational development throughout Kosovo.
- ➤ Study programs harmonized with the requirements of the labor market and comparable to programs offered in Western institutions of higher education.
- Character of the UPz multiethnic, multilingual and multicultural.
- > Study programs attractive and interdisciplinary, developed in close cooperation with international partners having in focus economics, law, social sciences and technology.

Strategic objective 2010 – 2015:

Quality higher education and research supporting social and economic development

Goals

- 1. Drafting of bylaws and harmonization of statutes of HEIs to the reviewed Law on Higher Education
- 2. Until 2015 participation in HE of the 18-25 age group has reached 35%
- 3. There is continuous support and equal opportunities for inclusion in HE for all groups: ethnic, gender, age, religion, special needs and other social groups.
- 4. Study programmes are in line with the labor market needs
- 5. There is increased budget and improved efficiency in execution of the budget (in line with the reviewed law)

Goals

- 6. Capacities are built for generation of additional resources in HEIs through research projects, consultancy services, infrastructure, etc.
- 7. There is continued improvement of quality in teaching and scientific research
- 8. There is institutional support and promotion in place for scientific research, innovation, technology transfers and entrepreneurship
- 9. Increased internationalization of higher education and research
- 10. Increased space and modernization of environment for studies and scientific research work
